## NOTICE SEEKING COMMENTS ON JOINT PROPOSAL AND ANNOUNCING PUBLIC STATEMENT HEARING

(Issued June 11, 2024)

Comments are sought concerning a Joint Proposal filed in the above-captioned proceeding on May 31, 2024. The terms of the Joint Proposal would establish a new rate plan for Liberty Utilities (New York Water) Corp. (the Company) for three years from April 1, 2024, through March 31, 2027. The signatories to the Joint Proposal are the Company and trial staff of the Department of Public Service.

The Company will remain organized in two separate service areas, Service Area 1 (SA1) and Service Area 2 (SA2). Service Area 1 is defined as the portion of the following water supply districts: Beaver Dam Lake, Cambridge, Dykeer, Hoey-DeGraw, Kingsvale, Long Island, Mt. Ebo, Waccubuc, West Branch Acres, and Wild Oak Districts. Service Area 2 is defined as the portion of the following water supply districts: Merrick and Sea Cliff Districts.

Rates would be levelized to moderate rate increases for customers in SA1, resulting in a \$13,704,197 increase in RY1 (17%), a \$13,704,197 increase in RY2 (15%), and a \$13,704,197 increase in RY3 (13%). In SA2, levelized increases would result in a \$3,536,025 increase in RY1 (9.2%), a \$1,833,278 increase in RY2 (4.5%), and a \$1,833,278 increase in RY3 (4.5%).

The proposed revenue requirements reflect a common

equity ratio of 48 percent and a return on equity of 9.1 percent. The proposed rate plan would also include an earnings sharing mechanism. All earnings attributable to an achieved return on common equity (i) greater than 9.75% and less than or equal to 10.1% will be shared 50%/50% between customers and shareholders, (ii) greater than 10.1% and less than or equal to 10.6% will be shared 75%/25% between customers and shareholders; and (iii) greater than 10.6% will be shared 90%/10% between customers and shareholders. Among other things, the Joint Proposal includes a water conservation program and customer benefit programs (including a Customer Assistance Program to aid low-income customers), and it requires that the Company take certain actions related to climate change and the environment.

The Public Service Commission (Commission) may adopt, adopt with changes, or reject, in whole or in part, any of the terms proposed in the Joint Proposal. The Commission may also adopt terms other than those proposed.

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Those wishing to comment on any aspect of the Joint Proposal will have the opportunity to make a statement on the record at the virtual public statement hearing. Any person wishing to provide a public statement on the record must register by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, July 12, 2024.

### To register and participate electronically:

The ALJs will continue the hearing until everyone wishing to speak has been heard or other reasonable arrangements have been made to include their comments in the record. Time limits may be set for each speaker as necessary to afford all attendees an opportunity to be heard. It is recommended that lengthy comments be submitted in writing and summarized for oral presentation. A verbatim transcript of the hearing will be made for inclusion in the record of this case.

## To listen to the hearing:
