## Your warm weather watering schedule

Water conservation is important for the environment, which is why Nassau County has restrictions in place on lawn watering.

- Lawn watering between 10 a.m. 4 p.m. is prohibited.
- Even-numbered addresses and non-numbered homes can water only on even-numbered days.
- Odd-numbered addresses can water only on odd-numbered days.
- Follow the Automatic Systems Zoned Map Schedule to relieve system strains during the summer peak mornings due to irrigation systems. You can access this schedule by visiting <a href="www.libertyenergyandwater.com">www.libertyenergyandwater.com</a> and selecting "Irrigation Guidelines" located under the "Smart Water Use" drop-down menu or by scanning the QR code below.
- If manually irrigating, each zone/area should not run more than 15 minutes.

In addition to saving water and reducing strain on our distribution system, these guidelines also reduce the likelihood of overwatering, resulting in a healthier, more attractive landscape.
