For this year's art contest, show how you (or your superhero self!) would help save water. Whether it's turning off the faucet, fixing a leak, or using smart tools, your art can inspire others to protect this precious resource.

Students within the Liberty service area, in kindergarten through sixth grade, are eligible to enter the **Be Water Wise** art contest. **Winning entries will be featured in Liberty's Be Water Wise Calendar!** Winners will be chosen by a panel of Liberty judges based on creativity and the impact of the message. **All participants will receive stickers featuring Liberty's mascot, Splashy, the water droplet.**

Get out your art supplies and use **standard white paper** (no bigger than 11"x17") to show us that you care about water conservation.

Be Water Wise Art Contest

Contest Rules and Guidelines



Eligibility

The contest is open to elementary school students within the Liberty service territory.

Theme

Entries should reflect the theme of water conservation. This includes, but is not limited to, topics related to the importance of saving water, ways we can conserve, as well as the importance of protecting our drinking water supply.

Artwork

All artwork must be the student's original work. Artwork, on standard white paper, should not exceed 11" X 17" in size; 8.5" X 11" is preferred.

Entry Form

Entry forms must be completed and signed by the student's legal guardian or teacher. Please attach the entry form with tape or other fixative (if using glue, be careful to use one that will not run through and damage the artwork). Please do not attach these forms with paper clips or staples, which can damage the artwork.

Mailing

Entries must be mailed flat or rolled in a tube - no folding, please! If mailing flat, we recommend you use cardboard or a similar material to protect artwork during mailing.

Rights to Artwork

Submissions become the property of Liberty. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant non-exclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted, which will not be returned.

Deadline for Entries

All completed entries must be postmarked or received by Nov. 30, 2025, and must be accompanied by an attached and completed entry form. Entry forms will not be accepted by e-mail. All entries should be mailed to

Judging

The judges will consider creative vision, artistic talent, an understanding of the value of water and an ability to communicate that message. Winners will be announced in January. Liberty reserves the right to not award a winner if no entry merits such designation.
